



A New Postgraduate Qualification

in

Health Communication, Consultation and Engagement

Introduction

The Centre for Health Communication Research at Buckinghamshire New University is working with the Consultation Institute to develop a new postgraduate qualification in health communication and consultation. The proposed course will cover the full range of skills, knowledge and behaviours required to be proficient and effective at a senior level in the fields of health engagement, involvement, communication and consultation.

This new course will reflect and address current challenges across the health and care sector including those faced by NHS Trusts and those faced by the new Integrated Care Systems. It will be open to all those who aspire to become better professionals in these important fields.

This major initiative is supported by NHS Providers, NHS Confederation and the Shelford Group - a collaboration involving the ten largest teaching and research NHS Trusts in England.

Key points

- The course will be delivered as a part-time programme over a period of 12 months.
- Successful completion of the course will lead to the award of the University's Postgraduate Certificate in Health Communication and Consultation and the right to use the appropriate letters after your name.
- The course will involve a blended learning approach with some online teaching, some face-to-face teaching and some project work.
- It will include guest contributions from some of the most senior people in the NHS and from senior leaders in other sectors too.
- It will be perfectly possible to complete this course while continuing with a full-time role.
- Course fees including all residential costs will be 12k plus VAT.
- The first course will start in January 2024.
- We anticipate that course fees will usually be paid by the course participant's employer, but the course will also be open to self-funded applicants.

Course content

Course content is being developed and finalised with a Content Board including representatives from Buckinghamshire New University, the Shelford Group, NHS Providers, NHS Confederation and the Consultation Institute.
